Recently, I've been thinking about Decembers in Los Angeles. The weather is very mild, and opening a window on Christmas Day isn't unusual. This reminiscing brought a song to mind as I've been preparing for Christmas. It debuted 59 years ago this month: "California Dreamin'," sung by The Mommas and the Pappas. Here are the lyrics:

All the leaves are brown And the sky is grey I've been for a walk On a winter's day I'd be safe and warm If I was in L.A.

Stepped into a church
I passed along the way
Well, I got down on my knees
And I pretend to pray
You know the preacher like the cold
He knows I'm gonna stay

All the leaves are brown And the sky is grey I've been for a walk On a winter's day If I didn't tell her I could leave today

California dreaming
On such a winter's day

The song's author, John Phillips, was suffering through a nasty East Coast winter. He wanted nothing more than to be back in Southern California. Then one night he had a dream—this very song!

The author of this song reminds me of Joseph. Imagine for a moment you are in this poor guy's shoes. You are legally contracted to marry a woman who's just told you that an angel came to visit her. And she tells you she's pregnant. Pregnant by the Holy Spirit, no less. Joseph's not stupid. He knows where babies come from. He can't ignore Mary's unfaithfulness.

Joseph's hopes and dreams have been shattered. All he has worked for, all he has dreamt, has been ruined. Like John Phillips in "California Dreamin," Joseph is stuck. Maybe Joseph goes for a long walk. Does he go into a synagogue he passes along the way? Does he kneel to pray, but nothing comes out of his lips? Does the rabbi know he's there? Does God even care?

The good news is He does care. He cares about you, and He cared about Joseph. We hear in Matthew chapter 1: "But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, 'Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. 
